UNDERGROUND RAILROAD BY GARY JENKINS

More than 100 attended the outstanding Underground Railroad Program, October 28, 2021 by Gary Jenkins. Gary, a Plattsburg alum, former KC police detective and historian presented stories from his book, The Immortal 10.





JEFFERSON HIGHWAY 1915-1926

In the early 1900s before automobiles were invented, the railroads dominated long-distance travel. Henry Ford started making his Model T in 1913. His assembly line production of a car for \$300 made traveling by car in reach for the masses. In 1915, there was a need for a north/south highway to match the newly constructed east/west "Lincoln Highway" that traveled from New York to San Francisco. The first north/south highway was named after Thomas Jefferson and it brought business and prosperity to towns it passed through. From Winnipeg, Canada to New Orleans, Louisiana, the route came right through Cameron, Plattsburg, Grayson and Trimble. In 1926 the National Highway System was finalized and approved. It was the beginning of the end for the Jefferson Highway. It was straightened, widened, moved out of some downtown communities or bypassed them all together. On December 2, 2021 Dave Schauer, Plattsburg Mayor and Greg Harris, City Administrator endorsed and supported the signage in Plattsburg to mark the former path of the historic Jefferson Highway. CCHS member and past president, Terry Wood led the Jefferson Highway initiative. Thanks to Terry for all his efforts.
